ABOUT

The Passion of Andrea 2 is a laughing-out-loud dance theatre piece by Simone Mousset, associate artist at The Place, London, and winner of the Luxembourgish Dance Award 2017.

The Passion of Andrea 2 is like trying to hold soap when it's wet. Masquerading as a sequel to an earlier, non-existent version of itself, it is a hilarious and mischievous con artist of a dance theatre piece about feelings of uneasiness, the inability to fully understand, and the painful desire for more. Born out of a desire to capture the feeling of being overwhelmed and confused in a climate of urgency, the piece explores the feeling of wishing there was more one could do, more one could be, that one could have more agency and somehow save the world – generally, that one could be more heroic overall.

The Passion of Andrea 2 is the solution that constantly escapes us. It is a medieval fable, magic trick, deadly game, bizarre dance-off, absurdist musical, sci-fi epic, all in one. Never completely sure of itself, this is a boisterous and comical show about a world of impossibilities, in which disappointment, idealism, anger, confusion, and multiple deaths collide.

Simone's work articulates textures around the uncertain, the chaotic, and the unresolved. Through the creation of playful and poetic worlds, situated on the border between fiction and a heightened reality, her work opens up spaces for existential questionings steeped in humour, strangeness, the surreal, and the fantastical. Her practice spans dance, theatre, voice work, comedy, magical thinking, visual arts, and writing. Simone is also the creator of the fictitious Ballet National Folklorique du Luxembourg, which is part of Luxembourg's forgotten, mythical past, and currently on tour in Japan.

BIOGRAPHY



Simone Mousset is a Luxembourgish choreographer based between London, Luxembourg, and France. Recipient in 2017 of the Luxembourgish Dance Award, supported by Réseau Grand Luxe in 2018-2019, and associate artist of Escher Theater in 2020-2022, Simone is currently associate artist at The Place, and accompanied by the Fondation Cléo Thiberge Edrom in France. Her company, Simone Mousset Projects, was founded in 2018 and is supported by the Ministry of Culture of Luxembourg since 2020. Recent commissions include works for London Contemporary Dance School, Nationalmusée / Musée National d'Archéologie, d'Histoire et d'Art in Luxembourg, and the Luxembourg Pavilion at World Expo 2021/2022.

Simone trained in London at Trinity Laban, the Royal Academy of Dance, and London Contemporary Dance School (EDge), touring works by Sasha Waltz, Igor Urzelai & Moreno Solinas, James Wilton, Tony Adigun, Matthias Sperling, and Rachel Lopez de la Nieta. In parallel, she trained with various folk dance ensembles including the Virsky Ukrainian National Folk Dance Ensemble in Kiev. She went on to work with choreographers and companies including Anu Sistonen, Jean Guillaume Weis, Dog Kennel Hill Project, Caracalla Dance Theatre, Provincial Dances, Olga Pona, Ballet Moskva, and others.

Her interest in artist development led her to participate in the Aerowaves Startup Forum for emerging dance presenters (2023), and to accompany artists at Les Théâtres de la Ville de Luxembourg in the role of artist companion. She was a participant of the multidisciplinary residency of the Opera Festival in Aix-en-Provence 2024 (ENOA network), and her book *On Uncertainty, Choreographic Spells, and Wanting to Be the Grass,* reflecting on her own making process, was published in May 2023 by the Centre National de Littérature as part of their Choreographical Talks series.
